**The Lessons**

**The First Lesson:** Hosea 11:1-11

When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols. Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them. I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks. I bent down to them and fed them. They shall return to the land of Egypt, and Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me. The sword rages in their cities, it consumes their oracle-priests, and devours because of their schemes. My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call, but he does not raise them up at all. How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, O Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender. I will not execute

my fierce anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and no mortal, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath. They shall go after the Lord, who roars like a lion; when he roars, his children shall come trembling from the west. They shall come trembling like birds from Egypt, and like doves from the land of Assyria; and I will return them to their homes, says the Lord.

**The Second Lesson:** Colossians 3:1-11

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things-- anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender. ## **THE HOLY BAPTISM**

### **Presentation and Examination of the Candidate**

*The Celebrant says*

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

#### ***Parents and Godparents***

**I present Harper Reese Hocoluk to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.**

*When the Candidate has been presented the Celebrant asks the parents and godparents*

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

***Parents and Godparents*                      I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant*    Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

***Parents and Godparents*                      I will, with God's help.**

*Then the Celebrant asks the following questions*

*Question*    Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

***Answer*                      I renounce them.**

*Question*    Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

***Answer*                      I renounce them.**

*Question*    Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

***Answer*                      I renounce them.**

*Question* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer* **I do.**

*Question* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer* **I do.**

*Question* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

*Answer* **I do.**

*The congregation stands and the Celebrant then says*

Let us join with Harper who is committing herself to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

### **The Baptismal Covenant**

He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.  
He descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again.  
He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again to judge the living and the  
dead.**

*Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People* **I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.**

*Celebrant* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

**People** I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

**People** I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

**People** I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

**People** I will, with God's help.

### **Prayers for the Candidate**

*The Celebrant then says to the congregation*

Let us now pray for Harper who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

*Leader* Deliver her, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

**People** Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Open her heart to your grace and truth.

**People** Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Fill her with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

**People** Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Keep her in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

**People** Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Teach her to love others in the power of the Spirit.

**People** Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Send her into the world in witness to your love.

**People** Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Bring her to the fullness of your peace and glory.

**People** Lord, hear our prayer.

*The Celebrant says*

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. *Amen.*

## Thanksgiving over the Water

*The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying*

The Lord be with you.

**People**            **And also with you.**

*Celebrant*    Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People**            **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

*Celebrant*

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water*

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen.*

## The Baptism

*Harper is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then baptizes her, saying*

Harper, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

*Then the Celebrant places a hand on her head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross, and saying*

Harper, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen.*

*When this has been completed, the Celebrant says*

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

*The Celebrant then says*

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*Celebrant and People*

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.
